Louisa Cawley has over three years' experience of forensic work at J P French Associates, having worked on over 250 cases in the areas of forensic speaker comparison, transcription and disputed utterance analysis as well as miscellaneous cases.

She holds an honours degree (BA) in Languages and Linguistics and a masters degree (MA) in Linguistics from the Department of Language and Linguistic Science at the University of York. She has studied the language and linguistics of English, French and German, and has undertaken courses in Phonetics (including acoustic phonetics), Forensic Phonetics, Articulatory and Impressionistic Phonetics, Language Variation and Change, Phonological Variation and Change.

She is a Teaching Fellow in the Department of Language and Linguistic Science at the University of York and is involved in lecturing on forensic speech analysis courses. She also delivers lectures and presentations to universities and other audiences.

She is an elected member of the International Association for Forensic Phonetics and Acoustics (IAFPA).

She has worked as a Research Assistant on an Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) project, studying child-speech and child-directed speech.

She has also appeared as an expert witness in a multi-handed drugs importation conspiracy case at Winchester Crown Court and in criminal cases undertakes work for both prosecution and defence.
