

Paul Foulkes: Summary Curriculum Vitae

Dr Paul Foulkes holds the post of Reader in the Department of Language and Linguistic Science at the University of York and during the academic year 2006 – 2007 worked as a full-time forensic speech scientist for J P French Associates. He has acted in a total of approximately 150 cases for both prosecution and defence. These have involved speaker comparison, disputed content analysis and evaluation of ear-witness evidence.

He has appeared as an expert witness in the Crown Court.

He has been a member of the British Association of Academic Phoneticians since 1998, the International Association for Forensic Phonetics and Acoustics (IAFPA) since 2001, and a member of the Research Committee of the IAFPA since 2003.

In 2005 he delivered in-house training seminars and practical instruction in analytic techniques to scientific and technical staff of the FBI and United States Secret Service in Washington DC.
