Professor Paul Foulkes: Summary Curriculum Vitae

Professor Paul Foulkes holds the post of Professor in the Department of Language and Linguistic Science at the University of York, where he is director of courses in forensic speech science. During the academic year 2006-2007 he worked as a full-time forensic speech scientist for J P French Associates. Since 1999 he has acted in a total of approximately 250 cases for both prosecution and defence. These have involved speaker comparison, disputed content analysis and evaluation of ear-witness evidence. He continues to act as an external consultant to J P French Associates. He has appeared as an expert witness in the Crown Court in the UK and the High Court in New Zealand.

He has been a member of the British Association of Academic Phoneticians since 1998, the International Association for Forensic Phonetics and Acoustics (IAFPA) since 2001, and was a member of the Research Committee of the IAFPA from 2003-2007. He was co-editor of the *International Journal of Speech, Language and the Law* from 2002-2008.
